2.1. Classification of the substance or mixture

Classification under CHIP: F: R11; C: R34; Sens.: R42/43

Classification under CLP: Flam. Sol. 1: H228; Skin Corr. 1B: H314; Resp. Sens. 1: H334; Skin Sens. 1: H317

Most important adverse effects: Highly flammable. Causes burns. May cause sensitisation by inhalation and skin contact.

Section 4: First aid measures

4.1. Description of first aid measures

Skin contact: Remove all contaminated clothes and footwear immediately unless stuck to skin.
Drench the affected skin with running water for 10 minutes or longer if substance is still on skin.

Eye contact: Bathe the eye with running water for 15 minutes. Consult a doctor.

Ingestion: Do not induce vomiting. If conscious, give half a litre of water to drink immediately.

Inhalation: Remove casualty from exposure ensuring one's own safety whilst doing so. Consult a doctor.

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4.2. Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed

Skin contact: Severe burns may occur. Blistering may occur.

Eye contact: Strong corrosive effect. Corneal burns may occur. The eyes may water profusely.

Ingestion: Swallowing will lead to strong caustic effect on mouth and throat, to the danger of perforation of esophagus and stomach

Inhalation: There may be irritation of the throat with a feeling of tightness in the chest.

Section 5: Fire-fighting measures

5.1. Extinguishing media

Extinguishing media: Carbon dioxide, dry chemical powder, foam. Suitable extinguishing media for the surrounding fire should be used.

5.2. Special hazards arising from the substance or mixture

Exposure hazards: Highly flammable. May form flammable / explosive dust-air mixture. Corrosive. In combustion emits toxic fumes. Carbon oxides. Nitrogen oxides (NOx). Hydrogen bromide (HBr).

Advice for fire-fighters: Wear self-contained breathing apparatus. Wear protective clothing to prevent contact with skin and eyes.

Storage conditions: Store in cool, well ventilated area. Keep container tightly closed. Keep away from sources of ignition. Prevent the build up of electrostatic charge in the immediate area. Ensure lighting and electrical equipment are not a source of ignition. Recommended storage temp 2-8 °C. Store under Argon.

Suitable packaging: Must only be kept in original packaging.
