# 2.1. Classification of the substance or mixture

#### 4.1. Description of first aid measures

to drink immediately. Consult a doctor.

Inhalation: Remove casualty from exposure ensuring one's own safety whilst doing so. Consult a

doctor.

**Skin contact:** There may be irritation and redness at the site of contact.

**Eye contact:** There may be irritation and redness. The eyes may water profusely.

Ingestion: There may be soreness and redness of the mouth and throat. Nausea and stomach

pain may occur. There may be vomiting.

**Inhalation:** There may be irritation of the throat with a feeling of tightness in the chest.

## 5.1. Extinguishing media

leaking containers leak-side up to prevent the escape of liquid. Eliminate all sources of

**Environmental precautions:** Do not discharge into drains or rivers. Contain the spillage using bunding.

Clean-up procedures: Absorb into dry earth or sand. Transfer to a closable, labelled salvage container for

disposal by an appropriate method. Do not use equipment in clean-up procedure which

may produce sparks.

under Argon.
